The honors were presented to his wife, Mrs. Faye Price.

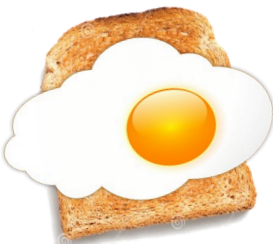

Message from the Mayor



Dear fellow citizens,

First, I would like to reflect on the Brunch held on July 18th. Your councillors served 150 people, which was a great success! The profits will be donated to an association chosen by your Council. From the comments received, many of you would like that such an event take place on a more regular basis. At the same time, we invite all associations and non-profit organizations that would like to fundraise, to use the Community facilities that are at their entire disposal.

We were all graced with the presence of Mr. Yves St-Denis, our MP, Mayor André Jetté from St-André-d'Argenteuil, Mayor Michel Boyer from Mille-Iles, Mayor Serge Riendeau from Brownsburg-Chatham, and Councillor Catherine Trickey, also from Brownsburg-Chatham.

During the public meeting of July 6th, your councillors have formally requested a grant for the construction of a new City Hall to the Quebec Municipal Infrastructure Program (PIQM). A mandate was also given to an architectural firm to produce a preliminary study for the new City Hall. The grant can vary between 60-80%.

It is clear that our old building no longer meets the needs of the population, nor the needs of the administration - sooner or later it must be replaced.

I think it is appropriate to rely on this source of funding while still being available, as there is no guarantee that this grant program will be maintained in the following years. I believe that collectively we must seize the opportunity while it is still available. I would like to reassure the people of Wentworth, as previously promised, I will not be increasing the tax bill during my mandate. I would like to reiterate this engagement. This project, as important as it is, will not result in an increase of the tax bill. Although, with the financial position of the municipality and a substantial grant, a portion of the surplus could be affected. The borrowing by-law # 99 has also reached its end leaving the opportunity to finance this important project.

Governing is the act of making decisions for the years to come. Your council acts in the same manner. I remain always open to comments and available to meet with you upon request.

In conclusion, I wish everyone a great fall, with plenty of heat and sun so you can fully enjoy the beautiful scenery that our Township of Wentworth has to offer,

Boat Wash Station

FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE LAKE LOUISA

At the extraordinary meeting of August 24th, the By-law 2015-002-01 «By-law to modify By-law 2015-002 for the protection of water bodies and access to Lake Louisa» was adopted. The principal modification is to provide an access permit (sticker) which will attest that the boat registered has not circulated in another body of water.

This Access Permit is now available at the Boat Wash Station during opening hours.

All motorised boats or vessels using the public access will be required to be sealed in order to receive the access permit. However, any boats not registered with an access permit will be obliged to be washed next spring.

Here is the information that is required in order to receive your access permit :

Name, address, proof of residency or property owner, boat description, pleasure craft number or Bill of Sale and the registration number of boat and/or trailer.

Have a good end of season !

We would like to remind you that all tempo garages are authorized between October 1st and May 15th of the following year. They must be installed at least 4.5m from all lot lines and cannot impede visibility on corner lots.

A maximum of 2 tempo garages per residence are authorized.

BED BUGS — Prevention et Treatment

What do BED BUGS look like ?

Bed bugs are brownish insects that are visible to the naked eye and 4 to 7 millimeters long. Since bed bugs feed on the blood of sleeping humans, they live mainly in bedrooms.

They are especially active at night and flee from light. During the day, they hide in dark, narrow, hard-to-reach places.

What are the signs BED BUGS are present ?

Most people notice they have bed bugs in their home because they wake up with itchy bites that resemble mosquito bites. The bites are often arranged in a straight line or clustered on parts of the body that are not covered during sleep. However, some people may have bed bugs in their home, but no bites.

How BED BUGS get into your home ?

Sometimes, you only need to make contact with an infested object once to bring bed bugs back home with you. The object may be clothing, a handbag or travel bag, a mattress, a sofa, a wheelchair, etc. Bed bugs spread quickly and often move from the bedroom to other rooms, and even to other apartments in the same building.

What to do if BED BUGS are present ?

Above all, don't try to solve the problem yourself. You must promptly contact a certified exterminator to resolve the bed bug problem and prevent from spreading.

Don't be a target ! Protect yourself from LYME DISEASE

LYME DISEASE is spread by bites from ticks infected with certain bacteria. Untreated LYME DISEASE can cause serious health problems weeks, months, or even years after the bite.

Here are some ways to protect yourself from ticks when you're outdoors

- stick to trails and avoid tall grass;
- wear light-coloured clothing so ticks will be easier to see;
- wear a hat, closed footwear, and long pants and sleeves;

WATCH OUT ! A BAT !

What if it had rabies ?



What is rabies virus ?

Rabies virus is a 100% incurable and fatal brain disease for humans. A small proportion of bats are infected with the virus and can transmit it to humans. Fortunately, there is a rabies vaccine that prevents the disease from developing, when administered after exposure to an infected bat.

How is rabies virus transmitted ?

Rabies virus is present in the saliva of infected bats. It can be transmitted to humans by a bite or scratch, even just a small one.

WATCH OUT !!!

Wounds inflicted by bats, such as bites, etc., may go unnoticed. That is why anyone who has touched or been touched by a bat and cannot exclude a bite, scratch, or contact of the animal's saliva with a wound or mucous membrane should :

- Wash exposed skin for 10 to 15 minutes with soap and water as soon as possible after contact;
- Contact Info-Santé 8-1-1, as rabies vaccination may be needed.

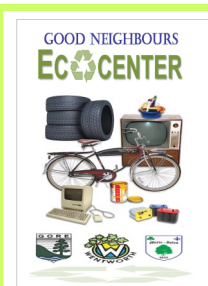
RECYCLING

Recycling has a major ecological impact. It allows us to reduce the volume of waste and to protect natural resources by saving raw materials and thus contributes to the protection of the environment.

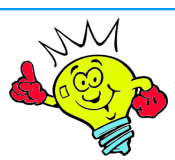
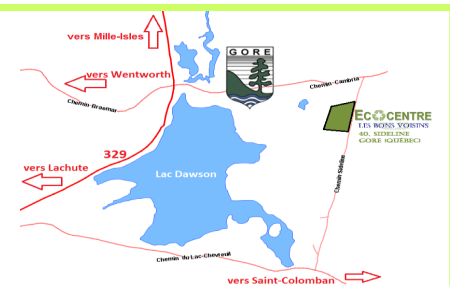
